Concepts: quarter, eighth note rhythms, aba form, mozart, create movement, shakes/scrapes, woods

Objectives:

- I can sing, move and play to music.
- I can move and play to music by Mozart.
- I can describe ABA form.

Songs/Activities:

- Listen and play along to "I Like Singin'"
- Make a home-made kazoo
- Learn about Mozart, and move to and play with "Larghetto"
- Learn about ABA form
- Sing the song "I'm Glad I'm Back at School"

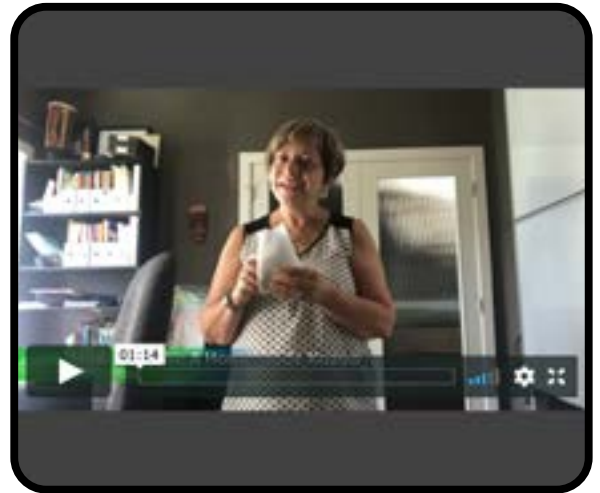
Activity #2: Make a home-made kazoo and play along with "I Like Singin'"

Make a home-made kazoo and play along with "I Like Singin'"

To make a home-made kazoo you will need

- a piece of wax paper or parchment paper 6"x6" or 16cm x16cm
- an elastic band
- an empty toilet paper roll

Play the song, "I Like Singin'" again - and play along!



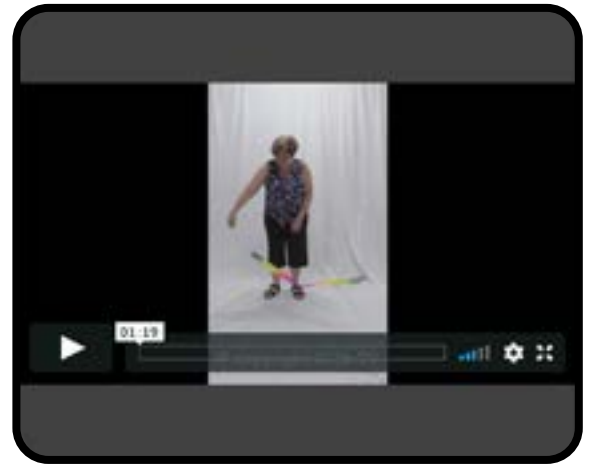
Activity #3: Learn about Mozart

Activity #5: Find something at home to use for sticks and shakers to play along with “Larghetto”

Find something at home to use for sticks and shakers to play along with “Larghetto”

For sticks you could use wooden spoons or two spoons.

For shakers, fill a small container with beads, popcorn, rice, lentils or anything that makes a nice sound.

Play along with the video. If you find it hard to read the rhythms, just play the beat.

Activity #7: Learn about ABA Form

Form in music is the way the music is organized.

In song #4, "I'm Glad I'm Back at School" there are three sections.

The first section is called the A section.

A different section gets a new letter - B.

When the first section is repeated, it's the A section again.

There are 2 questions at the bottom of the page.

What form is example 1?

What form is example 2?
